MOLLY PITCHER and JENNIE WADE

Two famous women who stood out in two different wars. Both were involved in the American side in the early days of this great nation of ours. Molly Pitcher built her reputation of being a "rammer" or "matross" in the Revolutionary War. Jennie Wade in the Battle of Gettysburg in the Civil War.

Jenny was just 20 years old and working at being a seamstress alongside her Mother in their house on Breckinridge St. when the first shots were heard. Mother and daughter who also baked bread for the Union soldiers nearby, quickly packed their necessities and moved to the house of Jennie's sister, Georgia Wade McClellan, on Baltimore St. They took with them, the 6 year old boy boarder, Issac, who was living with the Wade's. Two hours prior to the family moving in, Georgia had delivered a baby boy. Jennie, Mother, and brother Harry, who also lived in the house, helped take care of the baby, the new mother, and the 6 year old. Jenny and her Mother set about to mix the dough so it would rise by morning.

The second morning, being in the McClellan house, Mother rose early to tend to her oldest daughter and the new baby. Jennie too was up early, checking on the proofing dough, Suddenly shots rang out and into the house. One bullet shot through two doors in the kitchen and into Jennie Wade just below her shoulder blade, going through her heart, and lodging in her corset. Jennie fell over onto the table, just missing the bowl of dough, dead. The ladies, in shock, didn't quite to know what to do. Suddenly a Federal soldier came to the door for bread, saw the women in distress, so he wrapped Jennie in a blanket, *What happened to our heroines ? Mary Lu* carried her to the cellar, laying her on top of a chest of drawers. He made certain the blanket covered her and said a prayer over the lifeless body. The soldier slipped out of the house, Mother took over the bread making, and the battle went on. Jennie never knew that her betrothed had died from his wounds, nor had he known her fate. A rogue bullet had struck Jennie Wade dead, making her the ONLY civilian to be killed in the battle of Gettysburg. Mary Ludwig Hays McCauley, also known as "Sergeant Molly", is buried under a flagstaff and Cannon in Carlisle, Pennsylvania. A sculpture on the monument commemorates her courageous deed. As for our gal Mary Virginia Wade, killed on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of battle, is buried in Gettysburg's Evergreen Cemetery, under the monument unveiled on September 16, 1901. A flag flies 24 hours a day ay Jennie's grave. Betsy Ross is the only other woman to share that distinction.
